Just Beginning: Jonah's Journey by Jonah's Dad, Eric

April and I got engaged after dating for four months and were married eight months after that. We met at Regent University, which also served as the location for our wedding. Our outdoor ceremony was on a beautiful Sunday, October 10th, 2010.

Five months later April was pregnant. We celebrated

her 30th birthday and a baby shower in her home-

town of Americus, Georgia and were looking forward to returning home for her five-month ultrasound.

At the ultrasound, the technician abruptly ended the procedure and told us, awkwardly, that she had bad news. She had identified a number of abnormalities in the fetus. She took us to a doctor that, unfortunately, alluded that the best thing to do was terminate the pregnancy. To say it was

a demoralizing and disheartening experience is a major understatement.

As we drove home from the hospital after this shocking news, we sat in silence for a while feeling the amazing weight of uncertainty. I turned the radio on as a distraction for what I was feeling. A well-known worship song was playing. The words "Our God is an awesome God" seemed to stream straight into my spirit. I had sung it plenty of times from a place of excitement, yet in that moment there was only brokenness. Our voices trembled as we softly began to worship, "With wisdom, power and love, Our God is an awesome God."

During this time we have discovered that God has wisdom, power and a love that transcends the bounds of the world and confounds the minds of men. We transferred to another hospital that was better equipped to deal with high-risk pregnancies. It happened to be Norfolk General and we connected with a wonderful doctor who befriended us and saw us through to the delivery of our baby.

She explained to us that our baby had a small hole in his heart, misshapen kidneys, clenched fists, a clubbed foot; some of his internal organs were growing outside his abdominal wall (a condition known medically as an omphalocele), and other defects all indicating markers of a chromosome disorder called Trisomy-18. April got an amniocentesis at eight months that officially confirmed the condition.

We learned the grim statistics about Trisomy-18. Most babies die before birth and those that do survive usually live only a few days. Ninety percent pass away before making it to their first birthday. Our child has already exceeded expectations. I had originally wanted to wait until the delivery to find out the gender of our child. I changed my mind when my wife suggested that we do a baby reveal party. It was a terrific little event amongst close friends. We cut the cake and pulled out a piece that had blue icing on the inside. Blue for a boy.

That same day it was also determined that his name would be Jonah Caleb.

Jonah was born full term on Friday January 13th, 2012, at 12:37am; he weighed 4 pounds 8 ounces. A team of doctors quickly secured Jonah and rushed him off to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) in Children's Hospital of King's Daughters(CHKD). Jonah made good progress and we were able to take him home after just three weeks. He is on oxygen to help his breathing. He has a nasal-gastric tube to help him feed. He wears a pulse oximeter to monitor his heart rate and oxygen saturation. It beeps loudly if his numbers are too low or too high.

At the NICU we were connected with EDMARC and Jonah was accepted as a patient. We have only been with EDMARC for a month now, but feel like we have been adopted into their family. They have been a huge help for us, especially in this time of transition. Jonah's feeding tube came out in the middle of the night and Laurie came out at 2am in the morning to put it safely back in. Nancy helped him through a bout of constipation. Catina's social work visits have been very comforting and educating. She came with medical supplies and newborn diapers. Madalyn has embraced Jonah as if he were her own son. She has been especially encouraging to us through her heartfelt stories.

Jonah really enjoys interaction and loves to be held. The doctors are impressed at the accelerated healing of his omphalocele. It is about a fourth of its original size when he was born. Skin has almost completely grown over what remains. His clubbed foot is making a progressive correction with the help of physical therapy and a splint. At his last weigh-in he weighed 5 pounds 10 ounces. We rejoiced as we recently saw Jonah's first tears form in his eyes. We look forward to experiencing many more firsts with him.

I believe Jesus is showing me the wisdom of simplicity through Jonah. I feel like he has imparted the power of gentleness to me because of Jonah. I think he is teaching me the priceless value of sacrificial love. These are not easy lessons to learn. There is a certain glory that only comes out of suffering. Regardless of what future hardships we may encounter, I want

The reality of our work is that the children of Edmarc are very sick and many of them die. We cannot do much to change that basic fact. We can, however, be a quiet presence in people's lives at that most difficult time. We cannot be healers of the children, but we can be healers in the loneliness and fear. Everything we do for families, every act of kindness, leaves them better off than they were before we entered their lives. It is a privilege to be a part of such rewarding work.

At the end of the day, the event raised over \$18,000, but, more important, the message was shared of how important the services of Edmarc are to our entire community. Edmarc Social Workers Present at "When a Baby Dies" Conference

On February 8th, the social work staff at Edmarc had an opportunity to present at the "When a Baby Dies" workshop sponsored by the Eastern Virginia Perinatal Bereavement Coalition. The workshop was held at Mary Immaculate Hospital in Newport News and focused on providing caregivers the tools they need as they deal with bereaved families experiencing perinatal death. The workshop focused on teaching different ways to come to the aid of families with compassion and increasing understanding in responding to families when an infant child dies. The social workers presented on Options and Decisions/Perinatal Hospice and were able to share information about Edmarc, as well as to provide specifics about the support services that Edmarc Hospice for Children provides for its families. We also offered an overview of Edmarc's perinatal hospice program, which provides support services to a woman whose unborn child has been diagnosed with a life threatening or life limiting illness.

The social workers explained anticipatory grief, bereavement issues, and how to be sensitive to these families prior to and after a death. Legacy building and memory-making activities were also presented. The conference offered a great opportunity to educate and get the word out about Edmarc. Our thanks to Eastern Virginia Perinatal Bereavement Coalition for the invitation.
