Dear Friends of Edmarc,

As the seasons begin their quiet shift into spring, I find myself reflecting on my own seasons at Edmarc. This year marks my 27th year with this remarkable agency—nearly three decades of walking alongside families, staff, volunteers, and community partners who make Edmarc what it is. In that time, so much has changed... and yet, so much has stayed beautifully, purposefully the same.

What has changed? The landscape of pediatric illness, the advances in medicine, the ways families find us, and even the way our work is understood in the broader community. We've grown, adapted, and learned—sometimes quickly, sometimes gradually—always with the needs of the children and families as our guiding compass.

And yet, what remains steadfast is the heart of this agency. The unwavering commitment to compassionate, comprehensive, deeply personal care that has defined Edmarc for nearly 50 years continues to be our anchor. Every day, I am in awe of the staff who do this work with such gentleness and courage. They carry families through their darkest days and celebrate their brightest ones, often at the same time.

I am equally humbled by the volunteers whose generosity strengthens our programs and whose presence reminds our families that they are not alone. And to our donors—individuals, foundations, organizations, churches, civic groups—your belief in our mission is the reason Edmarc exists. Truly. We would not be here without you.

Perhaps the most meaningful reflections come from the families themselves. Over and over, I hear parents say, “We wish we never had to know Edmarc... but we are so thankful that you are here.” There is no more honest expression of the paradox at the center of our work: no one wants to need us, yet countless families are grateful we walk with them when they do.

The Hampton Roads community has long understood this delicate balance. For decades, you have recognized the value Edmarc brings to children and families facing profound heartache. You have supported us, lifted us, and ensured that no child must navigate serious illness without compassionate care. Your trust in us means everything.

And now, in recent years, we have also begun to witness something extraordinary: an increase in children who are experiencing a stable discharge from our program—children who no longer need our services because their conditions have improved. This is a profound blessing and a new kind of hope. It is a reminder that change is not always loss; sometimes it is healing, resilience, and the gift of more time.

So, as we move into another spring—another season of renewal—I offer my deepest thanks to this community. Thank you for sustaining us, for believing in us, and for walking alongside Edmarc as we continue to evolve while holding true to the mission that has guided us for nearly half a century.

We remain humbled by the work, grounded in compassion, and committed to standing with every child and family who needs us.

Some things change. Some things stay the same. And through it all, Edmarc's heart remains steady.

She loves school, but truly enjoys spending time with her friends, cherishing every moment with them before high school ends. Bella also has grand plans to become a pediatric dialysis nurse to help other kids like her in the future...

...because behind her bright smile and everyday joys lies a journey far from typical—one marked by resilience, devotion, and extraordinary strength.

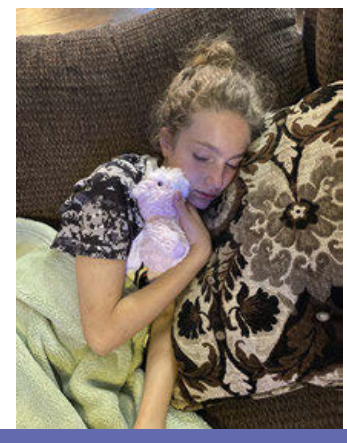

A Shift No One Expected

When Bella was twelve, she and her mom, Kaitlyn, began noticing subtle changes in Bella's health. At first, they chalked it up to middle school stress — nothing uncommon for a young teen navigating new challenges. But soon, Bella began vomiting daily, losing weight, and experiencing troubling numbness throughout her body.

Their growing concern led them to the emergency room, where doctors decided to run a CT scan. That moment changed everything.



A mass had formed near the top of Bella's spine.

"It was heartbreaking," Kaitlyn remembers.

Their whole world had fallen into disarray, but as a single mother, she had learned to face hard things head on. "You just have to do what needs to be done," she said—and she meant it.



Bella's first surgery successfully removed the tumor. But then came two relapses. With each new hurdle, this mother-daughter team pressed forward, determined not to lose hope.

During the third recurrence, doctors discovered Bella was also in kidney failure. Medication and dialysis could slow the

progression, but the best chance for long-term stability would be a kidney transplant. The family began the search for a match, but when no suitable donor appeared, Kaitlyn followed her intuition.

She had a hunch she was the answer.

Testing proved her right.

Though Bella protested—more worried about her mother's wellbeing than her own—Kaitlyn didn't hesitate. She would become Bella's living related kidney donor.

"It was a no brainer," she said. "I couldn't imagine not doing what needed to be done for my child."

Their bond deepened even further through this sacrifice. Bella recovered well, but Kaitlyn experienced complications after surgery. Being apart was devastating for two people who had always leaned on each other.

Once reunited at home, they began healing—physically and emotionally—side by side.

With Bella still facing her tumor, the family's challenges were far from over. It was Dr. Melissa Mark who first introduced them to Edmarc, and from that moment, Bella and her loved ones gained not only medical support, but an entire community of care.



The nurses and social workers became like extended family—checking in regularly, providing treatments, easing anxieties, and supporting not just Bella, but her mom, stepdad, and five siblings.

For the family, Edmarc relieved the mental load and—just as importantly—brought moments of joy and fun.

While much of the household's energy centered on Bella's care, they were grateful that her brothers and sisters were also embraced. They loved attending Edmarc events, especially Spring Fling, where the kids giggled their way through egg hunts and delighted in a visit from the Easter Bunny. This was only topped when, later that year, Santa himself arrived on their doorstep, arms full of gifts. The magic of the season felt real again.



A Bond Unbreakable

Today, one thing is unmistakably clear: Bella and Kaitlyn share a connection as strong as it is beautiful. Their inside jokes, tag team storytelling, and mutual selflessness reveal a relationship built on love, trust, and an unwavering commitment to one another.

Together with their family, they've learned to adapt, stay flexible, and—just as Kaitlyn always says—do what needs to be done.

Facing an unexpected diagnosis is overwhelming. The uncertainty alone can unravel the routines and rhythms of daily life. But families like Bella's remind us that with guidance, compassion, and the right support, balance can be restored.

For them, having Edmarc meant being met right where they were—in their own home, together. And home is exactly where Bella and her family can continue their journey: supported, strengthened, and surrounded by love.

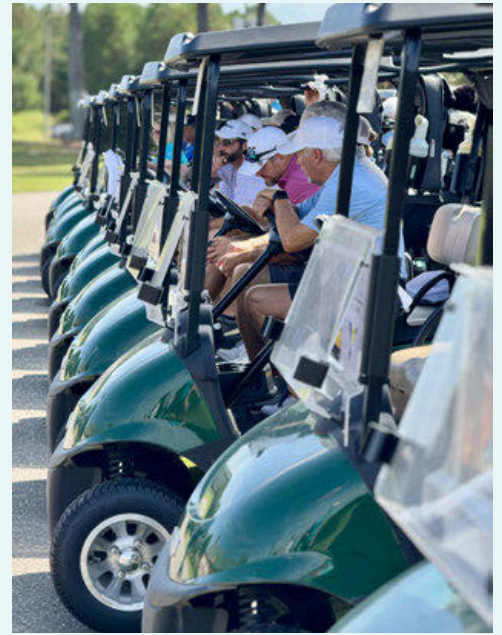

Navigating Grief with Found Family

Last summer, Camp M.A.G.I.C. returned to Triple R Ranch, giving children and families a space to laugh, reflect, and simply be together. It was a weekend where play and creativity blended with moments of remembrance, and where no one had to explain their grief to be understood.



Campers built meaningful friendships with peers who share similar journeys. One parent shared, "I'm so happy I got to go and find my people... now I feel like I found family." Caregivers also found comfort and support: "My child came home feeling less alone, and I felt reassured knowing we had tools to help us heal together."



On Saturday evening, families gathered for a bonfire. Candles were lit inside mason jars they decorated together earlier in the day, and letters to loved ones

were placed into the roaring bonfire – entrusting their grief to the flames. It was a quiet, powerful moment of reflection and connection.

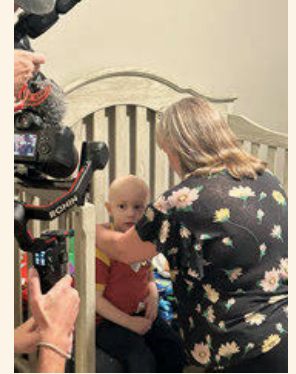
